

2026 Rocky MTN Jamboree Ride Descriptions



Rating Guide:

Advanced - ride is one in which the terrain is rocky and steep and is not a place for novice riders.

Intermediate - ride is one that has only moderate terrain challenges; that most riders can navigate without a lot of experience.

Beginner - ride is relatively smooth and easy.

Adelaide Rendezvous, Sponsored by Millard County Tourism - Stage at City Park #7 - Friday (NO TRAILER, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

This ride is sponsored by Millard County Tourism – the good folks from across the west mountain. Riders will travel west and south across the Pahvant Mountain and after a quick stop by the Adelaide campground will ride into Kanosh where Millard County will provide lunch. Hopefully the ride over and back will offer wildlife viewing opportunities with deer, turkey and possibly elk.

Almost There, Sponsored by Big O Tires - Stage at City Park #7 - Monday (NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

This ride almost goes somewhere. We head west through Rockwood Bull Valley and see the beautiful fall colors and large mountain range. We will travel almost to Kanosh but stop at Adelaide Campground for lunch. We then come back toward Joseph and almost get there. Then toward Elsinore where we almost get there too. But don't worry, we will make it back to Richfield! Sometimes roads can be rough and parts of it can have ruts depending on the weather. The terrain will be roads and trails. We promise beautiful scenery and maybe some wildlife and a great ride. Bring lunch and gas.

Anderson Dairy and More - Stage at Fairgrounds #15 - Wednesday (TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

We will trailer our machines to the little town of Koosharem, we'll hit the Paiute #01 trail and climb to Milos Kitchen. Then we drop into a narrow canyon loaded with dense aspen stands before it traverses across a canyon wall with amazing vistas all the way to Indian Flat where the trail passes over the ridge and drops into Box Creek Canyon. All of this is loaded with challenging 50" trails! The back half of the ride meanders throughout the Monroe Mountains past Barney Lake to the top near Marysvale Peak. We'll pass through recent logging areas and the amazing re-growth of forest following past wildfires! This ride offers something for everyone. Amazing views, incredible mountain trails and, if you're lucky, you may spot one of the area's incredible trophy elk.

Anthony Flat - Stage at Ross's Pizza #1 - Monday (TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

We make our way to the Gooseberry exit along Interstate 70. From there, we will take in the trails that make up the north side of the Gooseberry system. Spending most of the day on the Great Western Trail and a bit of the Old Spanish Trail. Bring along a lunch, camera, and a healthy appetite for riding.

Bar 86 - Stage at Bar 86 - Wednesday (NO TRAILER, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - ADVANCED)

This ride will leave from Bar 86 at 8:30AM. While there, feel free to fill up your thermos with coffee, get ice and enjoy a doughnut.. We will leave from the Bar 86 parking lot and head north to the end of Main St. From there we will make our way up the pole line to the trail head. The fun begins as we twist our way up and west. We will roll through pine trees climbing up,up,up where we will be rewarded with spectacular views looking over Deer creek canyon and Little Valley. Then we head back down to Bar 86 for a wonderful complimentary lunch buffet and some awesome entertainment.

Barney Lake - Stage at Fairgrounds #13 - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

We will trailer to the EMS building in Monroe where we will make a loop to the town of Koosharem for lunch and back. We will travel south out of Monroe across Poverty Flat that will take us to an old pioneer trail. We will then begin our ascent to the top of the mountain. Keep your eyes open for the wild life and enjoy the beautiful fall foliage. We then go to Barney Reservoir and onto the Paiute trail 01 which will take us to the Anderson Dairy. As we weave back and forth through the woods we will cross boardwalks that protect our meadows. After lunch, we will head back to the Koosharem Guard Station where we go across Monroe meadow that will take us down to the Old Sawmill Trail. This will drop us down to Monroe. Don't forget to bring some money for lunch or you can bring your own lunch and eat in the park.

Bear Valley, Sponsored by Black Bear Diner - Stage at Fairgrounds #14 - Monday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

Heading out we will travel east out of Richfield onto the Monroe Mountain. This ride will twist and turn along routes used by the early Mormon pioneers. There are a couple of steep sections with some switchbacks that will require your bear-like navigation skills. Hunting for your lunch is not required, it will be provided by the good folks at Black Bear Diner!

Beaver Mountain Loop, Sponsored by the Tushar Mountain ATV Club - Stage at U-Haul #18 - Tuesday & Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

The ride requires you to trailer your machine about 60 minutes to Beaver. Leaving Beaver and wind up steep, twisting, tree-lined trails, travel through flower spotted meadows, negotiate switchbacks through beautiful groves of aspens and finally follow bubbling streams along the Tushar Mountain. On the way back we will travel west back into Beaver. There are several gates we will be passing through that make this ride a 50". We will stop at several scenic lookouts and see the effects of wide fires in the area. This is an advanced ride due to the rough roads caused by erosion and recent fires.

Bugles at Twilight, Sponsored by Full Draw Design - Stage at EMS building in Monroe - 665 S. Main, Monroe - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - ADVANCED)

This ride will meet at the EMS building in the town of Monroe. We will meet at 2:00 pm, and be leaving at 2:30. From there, we will make our way up onto Monroe Mountain, stopping occasionally to see if we can get one of the local bull elk to talk back to us. Bring along your own dinner - but plan on hot chocolate and doughnuts for dessert as provided by Full Draw Design. Make sure you have plenty of warm clothes as the ride will come down off the mountain after dark.

Butch Cassidy Special - Stage at Home Depot #20 - Tuesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

Leaving from Circleville, this ride will allow you to ride back through time along the same canyons and ridges that Robert Leroy Parker, aka "Butch Cassidy," rode as a youth. Places like Wades Canyon, Buck Ridge, Rigger Park, Big Flat and Puffer Lake await your riding expertise. You will be required to trailer your machine approximately 50 miles to Circleville. This ride will challenge your riding skills. It's up through the Tushar Mountains. In addition, at the end of the ride, or maybe before, you will have a chance to visit the boyhood home of Butch himself.

Capitol Reef Special - Stage at Ogden's #17 - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

This ride may visit Hell Hole, Velvet Ridges, Bicknell Bottoms, The Castle, Gorilla Rock, Thousand Lakes, and Boulder Mountain. This ride has some of Utah's best kept secrets with views that will knock your socks off, including spectacular views of Capitol Reef National Park, Boulder Mountain, Henry Mountains and some of the most remote canyon country in the nation. Spend a little time playing, or watching others play on the Velvet Ridges – an open riding area that simulates sand dunes except with better traction, that will get your adrenaline flowing! Participants will have to trailer their machines 65 miles to the Great Western Trail trailhead in Torrey. The ride will consist of dirt, sand, rock, clay, water and a little pavement. The vistas will be amazing! We should finish the ride in time for you to drive your truck another ten miles or so down the highway to Capitol Reef National Park. It is well worth it if you haven't been there before.

Casto Canyon, Sponsored by Ogden's Superstore - Stage at Ogden's #17 - Wednesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - INTERMEDIATE)

Do you know the difference between Bryce Canyon and Casto Canyon? You can ride your wheeler up Casto Canyon! This ride has beautiful red rock "Hoodoos" and long needle pines, just like Bryce. First, we'll trailer south of Richfield 87 miles to the trailhead just past Panguitch. After unloading, we'll wind up Casto Canyon amongst the majestic long needle pines and "Hoodoos". One of the hardest things about this ride is trying to decide what you don't want a picture of, so don't forget your camera. After topping out of Casto, we'll head back down Lime Kiln Canyon and down the valley to the trucks. We will traverse dirt, sand, and gravel roads.

Chief Arapeen, Sponsored by Western AgCredit - Stage at IFA #4 - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS- ADVANCED)

This ride is sponsored by Western AgCredit and is dedicated to longtime guide Don Jamison. You'll climb from the trailhead east of Mayfield to the top of Skyline Drive. You will travel along one of the longest roads at that elevation in the United States as it crowns the Wasatch Plateau. You'll top out near White Mountain with the same views of the landscape that Chief Arapeen commanded 150 years ago. The ride slips below some large rockslides, through the swamps, and down the Pinchot trail back to the staging area. The ride will require you to trailer your machine 40 miles north to the little town of Mayfield.

Chief Walkara's Special - Stage at City Park #8 - Friday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZED MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

This ride will take you along the top of the Pahvant Range, along trails that were traveled by the famous Ute war chief, Walkara. You'll see Beehive Peak, a prominent red rock formation from all sides and angles. You'll be treated to breathtaking vistas of Sanpete, Sevier, and Millard counties as we navigate through towering pine and aspen forests at elevations exceeding 9,000 feet. The ride will return via Willow Creek and Aurora. Bring extra fuel.

Copper Globe Mine - Stage at Ross's Pizza #2 - Tuesday & Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

You will have to trailer your machine approximately 1 hour from Richfield. This ride will take you through the desert of the San Rafael Swell. Our destination is the Copper Globe Mine. The mine site is located in Emery County and operated from March 1899 to December 1997! Along the way, keep your eyes open for the wild horses that live in this part of the desert. We will make several stops along the way. Lunch will be on top of some cliffs that are over 1,000 feet high. There will be plenty of opportunities to see and photograph this untouched, wild country. A large portion of this ride is on maintained county roads. Bring lunch, snacks, lots of drinks, a camera and some binoculars! Come out with us and explore this spectacular desert, have a close-up look at some local history, and have a good time meeting new people.

Couples Special, Sponsored by Big Daddy's - Stage at Home Depot #20 - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZED MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

Take your honey on this ride to the top of the mountain! We'll be heading up Deer Creek Trail and up to the top of the Tushars. I've been told the sky is bigger at the top of the mountain. You'll have a chance to check it out for yourself as you go above timberline and stop on the summit at 11,500 feet in elevation. On a clear day you can see into Nevada to the west. Be sure to keep an open eye for mountain goats and other wildlife. You might want to bring along your binoculars. Don't worry about lunch – Big Daddy's has you covered.

Dairy Crawl - Stage at Jorgensen Powersport - Wednesday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - ADVANCED)

Approaching the Red Hills, with excitement and cheer,
We'll cross the sawdust pits, without any fear.
Up rocky hills, we'll climb with delight,
With views of the city, such a magnificent sight!
In the rock playground, with joy we'll play,
Climbing obstacles, breaking parts along the way.
Through Dairy Canyon, we'll boldly ride,
To the top of the mountain, we'll ascend with pride!
Down to Hay's Hill, the trail will swiftly descend,
Marvelous rock formations, around each bend.
Under the freeway, we'll start our return,
With new scratches & dents, we bid the trail adjourn!

Plan on grabbing lunch at Herb's Place where we started the ride.

Devil's Armchair, Sponsored by IHC - Stage at City Park #6 - Tuesday & Friday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

This ride goes west out of Richfield and climbs to the top of the Pahvant Mountain range. The riders will have an amazing view of the Devil's Armchair and the valleys beyond. On a clear day you can see across the west desert of Utah all the way to Nevada! The route is wide with moderate turns and no major obstacles. This ride is approximately 30 miles in length.

Duck Lake, Sponsored by Central Utah Health Department - Stage at Fairgrounds #15 - Monday

(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

This ride visits Big Lake, Annabella Reservoir, and Deep Lake, yet it draws the name "Duck Lake"? Yes, there is a Duck Lake, but it's a pond compared to the others. Maybe run the question past your guides and see if they know the answer. This is a beautiful ride and a great time on the mountain. Lunch will be provided by the Central Utah Health Department.

Eagle Canyon Adventure, Sponsored by Peterson Plumbing - Stage at IFA #4 - Tuesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - ADVANCED)

This ride requires you to trailer your machine around 75 miles - but it is well worth it. This ride follows what is known as the Devil's Racetrack and includes just about every kind of terrain. For 1/8th of that area, there are rough rocks and a waterfall climb. It will challenge you! There are a few ledges and overlooks that will require every bit of your attention. There is a lot of history and beauty along this ride as well. We will start at Justensen Flat, head over to Eagle Canyon Arch, Swazy's Cabin, Devil's Racetrack and then North Coal Wash where we can view a few petroglyphs. These are just a few of the natural sites and wonders riders will enjoy along the way. The ride is advanced for terrain. Be sure to bring lunch and a full tank of fuel.

Elkhorne and Thousand Lakes - Stage at Fairgrounds #14 - Tuesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - INTERMEDIATE)

Embark on a picturesque ride featuring numerous photo opportunities. Overlook Cathedral Valley, Thousand Lakes, the San Rafael Desert, and many other majestic vistas. Make sure to pack a lunch, as we'll be out for around 8 hours. We'll spend most of our time exploring the scenic 50" trails on this exciting new route. Get ready for an unforgettable adventure!

Ephraim Canyon - Stage at Ross's Pizza #1 - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 66" OR LESS - INTERMEDIATE)

Travel 50 miles to Ephraim and then a few miles up Ephraim Canyon to the staging area. From there we'll make our way up to the Skyline Drive. The elevation at the top is around 10,500 feet. The Arapeen OHV Trails have some spectacular views and breathtaking scenery. We'll make a loop east toward Joe's Valley Reservoir, stopping at Grassy Lake for lunch. We'll make our way back to the skyline and tie back into different trails back to the vehicles. There is one short trail that is rough and rocky with an advanced rating, our guides will make sure you get through safely.

Escalante - Stage at Top Stop #21 - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - STREET LEGAL ONLY - INTERMEDIATE)

This ride is for street legal vehicles only! And, requires you to trailer your machine to Loa, about 55 miles from Richfield. We will head south on the 01 toward Escalante where we drop off onto the Posey Lake Road. We will stop at Posey Lake for a restroom break. Then across to Hells Backbone where we will stop to enjoy the canyon views below. From there we will head into Escalante for lunch and gas, you can bring your lunch or buy lunch in town. We will drive west on highway 12 for a couple of miles then we will head north up the canyon, where we can see ancient Indian dwelling high in the canyon walls. Then back to Posey Lake and a fast ride back to our trailers. This is a long ride so we will be moving along at about 35 miles an hour on gravel roads, only to slow down to enjoy the spectacular views.

First Creek, Second Creek, Three Creeks, Sponsored by US Forest Service - Stage at U-Haul #18 - Wednesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

You will trailer approximately 27 miles southwest of Richfield up Clear Creek Canyon to the designated off-loading area at the Shingle Creek road junction. From here you will ride to Cove Fort and travel the west Pahvant range through First Creek, Second Creek and Three Creeks along with a few other creeks. The route will take you through Dog Valley, Dry Wash and John Watts on some of the best trails found in the area. This ride is advanced due to the terrain and distance.

Fish Lake Hightop - Stage at Fairgrounds #14 - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

Trailer to Koosharem Reservoir, turn east across the dam, unload and head up the old Fish Lake Banburger Road. We will travel East to the South side of Fish Lake then up to Hightop and Hancock Flat. This is some steep downhill terrain. Then we will head back to the trucks. Make sure to pack a lunch and a love of the mountains.

Flat Canyon - Stage at City Park #10 - Monday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

Leaving from the City Park we will travel out of Richfield and up Dairy Canyon through some of the system's most gnarly terrain. Once on top, you will make your way into Flat Canyon (which is anything but flat) and then south to a trail some of the locals call the "Razorback" with rocks that are a lot like the back of the ancient Stegosaurus. The ride then travels back north and comes down off the mountain on a steep section of downhill trail. This ride will leave at **8:35 am** from the staging area.

Fly Fishing Trifecta - Stage at Fairgrounds #12 - Monday & Wednesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

On this ride you will require to trailer your machine some distance. How far is to be decided by the fish. What we can promise you is an amazing day full of fun riding and fishing for Brook Trout, Grayling and Tiger Trout. **You must possess a current Utah fishing license (can purchase a one day license at wildlife.utah.gov) and bring your own fly-fishing equipment.** This is a great way to enjoy the best our mountains have to offer. Make sure to pack a good lunch. **(Where we go fishing changes year to year according to where the fish are.)**

Freddy's Coca-Cola Classic - Stage at City Park #8 - Tuesday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - ADVANCED)

This is a long one folks! No joking! Participants will weave and bob from Richfield all the way to Fishlake and return via Monroe and Cove Mountains. Did we mention that this one will be over 100 miles! You know what that means. We have to keep this one moving along at a **quick** pace, regardless of dust, to make it home before the sun sets. Be sure to bring a good lunch and some tasty snacks.

Highway Road Trip, Sponsored by Jorgensen Ford - Stage at Jorgensen Ford - Thursday
(NO TRAILER OR ATV NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY STREET LEGAL PASSENGER VEHICLE
"Truck")

This ride is for anyone who is ready for a break from the dust, mud and wind on the trails. Ditch the atv and come join us for a nice leisurely road trip through some of the most scenic highways and byways of Sevier and Piute counties. On this road trip we will be visiting places like Butch Cassidy's boyhood home, Otter Creek State Park, Fishlake and Seven Mile. We will see everything from the beauty of our Valley all the way up to the aspen and pine trees of the Fishlake National Forest, and if we're lucky the fall foliage will be at peak color. Lunch will be provided for those who sign up for this road trip before the jamboree cutoff, but no one will be turned away from joining us the day of the ride.

Hunt and Gather - Stage at Rocky Mtn Power #3 - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - BEGINNER)

This ride will expose you to some of the tastiest and most famous wild edibles in the West! You'll also get to try some Deer and Elk meat previously harvested from this very mountain range...all while experiencing the most beautiful, dense aspen forests around. We'll start by trailering 15 miles to the Sand Ledges. We'll unload and head up the PST 56 past Sweet Water Spring, Cedric's Dugway, and towards Lost Creek Reservoir. From there we'll travel down to Gates Lake for lunch (please bring your own food, the Deer and Elk will only be a sample). After lunch, we'll head to UM Pass for an incredible view. I expect to stop often to discuss a variety of plants along the way. You're welcome to bring small bags or containers for personal harvesting of wild edibles. Your homework before the ride is to research "Stinging Nettle".

**Kimberly Mountain, Sponsored by Coldwell Banker - Stage at City Park #8 - Thursday
(NO TRAILER, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)**

We will head south out of Richfield to the town of Elsinore where we will jump onto the powerline trail. The trail then continues south across the west bench, past the town of Joseph, where it drops into Fremont Indian State Park. From there we will head up toward Kimberly Ghost Town, where we will make a loop and then head back.

**Leisurely and Scenic, Sponsored by InfoWest - Stage at Uhaul #19 - Monday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)**

Join us as we see some of the best country the trail system has to offer. Leaving Monroe city, we will travel onto Monroe Mountain and then make our way up, down, through and around scenic trails that are unmatched. We will be visiting Manning and Box Creek Reservoirs along the way.

**Lost Creek - Stage at Snow College #11 - Monday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)**

This ride requires riders to trailer their machines 18 miles north to Salina. The journey will take riders up the Lost Creek escape route all the way to Lost Creek Reservoir. The ride will take a couple of challenging side trails that will require you to have 4-wheel drive.

**NEW! Lunch with Butch Cassidy - Stage at Top Stop #21 - Tuesday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)**

Join the bunch and get ready for a wild trek through the heart of outlaw county. Featuring trails of the Paiute Trail System where you will get the chance to try out your driving skills as we crawl through washes and creeks. We'll stop in Circleville to connect with Cassidy's boyhood roots and enjoy spare ribs for lunch. This ride will shoot by restrooms, reservoirs, ranches, a gas station and much more!

**Manti Canyon, Sponsored by Gary's Shoes - Stage in parking lot behind Gary Shoes - Tuesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZED MACHINE - ADVANCED)**

The ride requires that you trailer machines to Manti (45 miles). Then it's up the old Sheep Trail, on to the Skyline Drive and to the family cabin near Ferron Reservoir where Gary, Scott and crew will provide tasty hamburgers. After lunch, some twists and turns and challenges on the way back down Manti Canyon to the trailhead.

**Maple Springs, Sponsored by Ellis' Country Auto Salvage - Stage at Ross's Pizza #2 - Friday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)**

This full day ride is in memory to Ellis Quarnberg, guided by Ellis' family, and was one of Ellis' favorite rides. It starts in Gooseberry just off the Salina Canyon frontage road. We then cross Salina Creek and head up to Maple Springs where there are numerous stories of calm feelings and beautiful colors. Be sure to take a moment and capture nature's beauty through the winding colorful trees. Moving over to Antone Hollow, you'll enjoy a short lunch stop and the chance to visit with other riders that will hopefully bring lasting friendships. Through the creek again and on to the rocky part of the ride which makes it advanced. Then you'll travel through the heart of Gooseberry and cross Niotche Creek as you make your way to Oak Ridge and back to your vehicles.

Mayfield Canyon, Sponsored by Big O Tires - Stage at Ross's Pizza #2 - Monday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 66" OR LESS - INTERMEDIATE)

Come join the guys from Big O Tire as they guide you up Mayfield Canyon on a grand adventure. You will need to trailer your machine an hour north of Richfield. We will be going up Beaver Creek through the Clear Creek flats, then stopping to take a peek at the historic Mayfield town cabin. We will be taking our time to see a couple of the beautiful sights on this trail as we travel up twelve mile canyon. We will be stopping along the way to eat lunch, so make sure you pack a good one.

Mountain of Gold, Sponsored by Epic Pain Solutions - Stage at Snow College #11 - Friday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

This ride requires that you trailer your machine 28 miles south to Marysvale City Park. During the ride you will visit the Ghost Town of Bullion and Miners Memorial Park where you will have an opportunity to step back in time to when steel was driven by hand and tons of muck was hauled to the mill in search of Gold. The ride will continue to Hennessy Point – a breathtaking view; don't get too close to the edge! Then on to the top of Alunite Ridge, that's well above timberline folks, where we'll look for Mountain Goats and measure how big the sky is at the top of the mountain. Then it's a downhill run through Cottonwood and back to Marysvale. You do not want to forget your camera.

Mussentuchit - Stage at IFA #4 - Wednesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

We will be trailering our machines about 60 miles out to the desert. You will have the chance to see wild horses, burros, antelope, or bighorn sheep. You can take the brave step to the edge of a ledge with the canyon floor 100 feet below and see vistas of mountain ranges 100 miles away. Bring extra gas as needed, water, lunch, camera, binoculars, jacket, and a smile.

Mytoge Mountain, Sponsored by Ensign Staffing - Stage at Top Stop #21 - Monday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

This ride will travel onto Mytoge Mountain where riders will get some unique and fantastic views of Fish Lake. The ride also includes a climb onto the Fishlake High Top for a 11,000 ft. high point that offers fantastic views in all directions. You will have to trailer your ATV/UTV some 40 miles to just south of Fish Lake. Make sure to bring along a good lunch.

Niotche, Sponsored by the Sevier County Commissioners - Stage at Ross's Pizza #1 - Wednesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - INTERMEDIATE)

Spend the day with the Sevier County Commissioners on this ride. You will trailer your machines to the Sheep Creek trailhead in the beautiful Gooseberry area east of Salina. This ride has it all as it travels past Twin Ponds, Cold Spring, Farnsworth Lake and Lost Creek reservoir. Riders will enjoy a lot of trail and great scenery as you travel over UM Pass, into Sheep Valley and then over Niotche. Lunch will be provided by the Sevier County Commissioners.

Nothing Like It In The World - Stage at Fairgrounds #12 - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

We will head to Koosharem; about 30 miles. Lorenzo Hans "Renzo" Larsen (1910-1988) tended sheep and created art for forty years up on the Fish Lake Plateau. Learn how and why he did it and enjoy a beautiful ride at the same time. We'll have you home mid afternoon and you will be loaded with history and art that you will never forget.

Paiute Trail Hall of Fame, Sponsored by the Paiute Trail Committee - Stage at Home Depot #20 - Monday

(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

If you want to ride with Fred Christensen, Roger Foisey, Stan Adams, Max Reid or Bryan Carter this is the ride for you. You will trailer your machine to the Hoovers Rest Area. The ride will go up Deer Creek past the Silver King Mine, into the Kimberly area alongside trails that will take you beneath the Hogback and Marble Top mountains. The ride will come down the back side of Kimberly, into the Fremont Indian State Park, up the Max Reid trail and then back down Deer Creek. Mines, vistas, historic Native American culture, and a great riding adventure; what more could you want? Make sure to pack a lunch and have a full tank of gas.

Parker Mountain - Stage at Ogden's #16 - Wednesday

(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

We will be riding on Parker Mountain and hopefully spot some antelope. Parker Mountain is a unique geophysical region where the Colorado Plateau meets the Great Basin. This ride follows the road systems that traverses the entire Parker Mountain Plateau. Greater sage grouse, Utah prairie dog, and antelope are common species in this vast open landscape. You will have to trailer 40 miles to the Parker Mountain turnoff on Highway 24. Make sure you pack a lunch!

Pahvant Peach Cobbler, Sponsored by State Bank of Southern Utah - Stage at City Park #8 - Monday

(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

Come ride with us along the beautiful Pahvant trails, exploring the red and orange hills, the juniper desert, and the stunning arid landscape. Bring a lunch, as we will be stopping often to enjoy the scenery and keep your eyes open for elk and other wildlife. Along the way, we'll have a surprise stop for a delicious treat.

Precipitous Journey - Stage at City Park #6 - Wednesday

(NO TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

This ride involves a very steep and challenging "Oh Crap" trail. This takes you into Flat Canyon and then up that "precipitous" trail. We'll finish with a trip around Indian Peak and back to Richfield. 4-wheel drive machines only and no riding double.

Red Rock Real Estate Poker Run - Stage at Red Rock Real Estate - Wednesday

(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

This Poker Run ride has lunch provided at Monroe Meadows. The ride leaves from Red Rock Real Estate and heads up Cove Mountain past Big Lake. The ride will go through aspen and conifer forests and open meadows with spectacular views of Grass Valley to the East and Sevier Valley to the West. We will then stop for lunch. From there we'll meander through the meadows down the canyon into the town of Monroe and back to Red Rock Real Estate.

Rex Reservoir, Sponsored by Richfield Parks and Rec. - Stage at Fairgrounds #15 - Friday

(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

This ride travels East out of Richfield toward Glenwood. The roads and trails twist and turn up to the Sevier Plateau and on to the reservoir where we will stop for lunch. We then make our way back to Richfield. This is mostly a leisurely ride but has a few hills, "rock gardens", and yes "ruts" that may need your attention. Be sure to bring your lunch.

Rib Special - Stage at Fairgrounds #14 - Friday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

If you like barbeque ribs, then you better get signed up for this one. This ride will cross Cove Mountain and descend on the quaint community of Koosharem. Fill your gas tank at the Grass Valley Merc, then drop by the Koosharem Café to fill your food basket. The prices are reasonable, and you won't be disappointed. Build up your appetite with a ride and then work it off with some more riding – what more could you ask? All you need is a few bucks in your wallet.

Ring-Around Mary's Nipple - Stage at Fairgrounds #12 - Friday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 66" OR LESS - INTERMEDIATE)

Mary's Nipple, Molly's Nipple, or Mt. Musinia, they are all names used to refer to an iconic peak seen from around the area. This ride doesn't go on top of the Nipple, at 10,866 feet. The ride is on mostly decent mountain roads, but some of it resembles trails. You will travel on part of the skyline drive, famous for its beautiful views of high mountain lakes and meadows as well as other mountain ranges and valleys. We will be above 10,000 feet for a good portion of the ride. You may see deer, elk, eagles, and other wildlife. Bring a lunch and some cold weather gear just in case, because it can get pretty chilly up that high.

Ring-Around Mount Terrill - Stage at Ross's Pizza #1 - Tuesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

This ride takes you over some of the best trails and most beautiful scenery the State of Utah has to offer, Seven-Mile, Gooseberry, Gates Lake, Flat Top, Antone Hollow, Yogo Pass and UM pass ... all the way around Mt. Terrill. You'll see this 10,000'+ peak from every side. This ride requires trailering 36.5 miles east to the Sheep Creek Trailhead where you will immediately begin riding amazing 50" trails. You will encounter steep hill climbs, rock gardens, high mountain vistas and tight trails while traveling through amazing aspen groves and small open meadows.

Rivers and Woods, Sponsored by Homebase Resort - Stage at Fairgrounds #12 - Tuesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - ADVANCED)

This ride has everything you want – a good long ride, three creeks and plenty of mountain scenery! The ride requires that you trailer to Joseph. From the trailhead the ride will proceed to Deer Creek near Hoovers and then up onto and through the Tushar Mountains where you will go past and/or through Fish Creek, Shingle Creek, and Dry Creek before coming off the Pahvant mountain and back to Joseph. Pack a lunch and come enjoy all the fun this ride has to offer.

Rock Shop at Elbow Ranch - Stage at Ogden's #16 - Monday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - BEGINNER)

This ride gives riders an opportunity to see one of the little known secrets of the Paiute Trail – The Rock Shop at Elbow Ranch. The ride itself is absolutely beautiful and is open to machines of all sizes. The ride will be high in the foothills above the Elbow Ranch with great views on all sides. Be sure to bring lunch and your camera. We will be stopping at the rock shop to eat lunch and tour the shop – truly one of the friendliest and most interesting spots along the trail. This leisurely ride will have a combination of both road and trail travel.

Rockwood, Sponsored by Shellie Mackay ERA & All American Beard Oils - Stage at Trailhead #5 - Tuesday & Friday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

What's Rockwood? Well, it's the location of an old Forest Service Guard Station. The old buildings are gone, but the spot remains tucked into a handsome grove of aspen with a nearby spring. This is a laidback day through vegetative transitions and with the possibility of seeing deer and elk.

Roosevelt Springs - Stage at Ogden's #16 - Tuesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

Departing from the Sulphurdale rock quarry north of Beaver, the ride travels between Woodtick Hill and Gillies Hill, passing extinct volcanic features such as Crater Knoll and other ancient vents and granite outcroppings. It connects with Cunningham Wash Road to traverse Bearskin Mountain before reaching Roosevelt Hot Springs, Mag's Brothel, and the Chocolate Chip Cabin. The route continues through Flintstone Valley, past Salt Cove Reservoir, and loops back along the original path to the staging area. Make sure you have plenty of gas, bring a lunch, water, and dress for the weather.

Saddle Pass - Stage at Stage at U-Haul #19 - Wednesday & Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

On this ride we'll spend some time in Saddle Pass on the south end of Thousand Lake Mountain where the vista of the Fremont River through Capitol Reef National Park and the Henry Mountains will take your breath away. We'll weave our way through the forest, past meadows and streams. You will see the contrast of the autumn colors with the bright red and gold landscape laying thousands of feet below. You'll visit a canyon overlooking what the locals call "Little Bryce". Along the way you will see beautiful mountain lakes and the ancient Bristlecone Pine. Make sure to bring along a good lunch. We will be stopping at Elkhorne Campground to eat.

Sand Ledges - Stage at Fairgrounds #15 - Tuesday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)

This ride will take riders east from Richfield into areas traveled by Chief Black Hawk. The ride will take a couple of challenging 50" trails that will require you to have 4-wheel drive. The Sand Ledges and Rose Meadow are just a few of the things we will be traveling past on our journey. Bring a good lunch.

It's Back! Scones at Sunset - Stage at Snow College #11 - Thursday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - ADVANCED)

This ride will meet in the Snow College, Richfield parking lot at 2:00 pm. The ride will spend the afternoon and evening on the mountain west of Richfield. We will take a few detours to enjoy our favorite trails and see some sites along the way, ending up at an overlook near Devil's Armchair. Bring a dinner along to enjoy and binoculars if you have them - there may be some deer or elk on the ridge below. After dinner, we will make some Utah scones with honey butter for dessert and then watch the sunset. We expect to arrive back in Richfield after dark so be sure to bring along plenty of warm clothes and don't forget to check the lights on your machine.

Sheriff's Ride, Sponsored by Sevier County Sheriff's Office - Stage at City Park #6 - Monday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)

This gives you the opportunity to ride with some of Sevier County's finest! The ride will be guided by the local Sheriff and some of his Deputies and will weave in and out of the local canyons before stopping at the gun range for a dutch oven lunch and some shooting. The real question is ... can you outshoot the Sheriff? You must bring along your own shotgun and/or pistol as well as the ammunition.

**Shop till you Drop, Sponsored by Richfield Area Chamber of Commerce
Meet at City Park at 10:00 am next to Guide Trailer - **Wednesday**
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - **BEGINNER**)**

This adventure is sponsored by the Richfield Area Chamber of Commerce and is designed to give Jamboree participants an opportunity to get to know Richfield a little better. Please note, this ride starts at the City Park at 10:00 a.m. From there you will head out on a self-guided tour throughout the town, taking time to stop and shop in a couple of our stores unique to Richfield. Lunch will be provided by Larsen's Ace Hardware, where you will have the opportunity to cook and dress your burger to your liking.

**Silver King, Sponsored by the Fremont Indian State Park - Stage at Home Depot #20 -
Wednesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE- **ADVANCED**)**

Join us as we take a look at the amazing history of this trail, provided by the Utah Cultural Site Stewardship Program Coordinator. We will experience beautiful views of the Rocky Mountains and enjoy epic trails. Along the way we will learn about the fascinating history and experience the archaeology of this area, this ride really has got it all! The ride begins at Fremont Indian State Park – requiring you to trailer your machine 20 miles south on I-70. We will visit a portion of the Max Reid Trail, the Silver King Mine, Kimberly Ghost Town, Mill Creek, Fish Creek and the old Cove Fort Highway. Any machine 50” or less will have the opportunity to enjoy a width restricted segment of the Max Reid trail. Those with machines greater than 50” will take an alternative route. Don't miss out on this fun ride back in time with new friends from all over the world.

Sister City Visit - Stage at City Park #9 - **Wednesday & Friday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZED MACHINE - **INTERMEDIATE**)**

Come ride with us to Richfield's sister city to the west, Fillmore. We'll go over the top of the Pahvant Mountain along Chalk Creek. While in Fillmore, top off our tanks and get some lunch, so bring along a few bucks. We'll finish our visit a return via Sand Rock Ridge.

Soaring with the Eagles - Stage at Ogden's #17 - **Tuesday & Friday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - **INTERMEDIATE**)**

We will be trailering our machines to the rest stop south of Big Rock Candy Mountain. Then it's up the beautiful Deer Creek Canyon. We'll take a side trip to the Silver King Mine, where there are restrooms. After that, we'll head up to where the eagles soar and the wild mountain goats live above 11,500 feet, the highest point of the Paiute Trail System. We will make a stop to look for the goats, so bring your binoculars or scope to spot them. Then we'll continue over the top and start down “the other side of the mountain to see what we can see”, turn around and head down Beaver Creek to Marysville. Stopping there for a break before making our way back to the trucks. We will be spending most of our day on high mountain roads where the air is cool.

Spanish Trail Special, Sponsored by Quality Inn - Stage at Rocky Mtn Power #3 - **Friday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50” OR LESS - **ADVANCED**)**

This ride travels along a portion of the Old Spanish Trail that went from Santa Fe, New Mexico, through southwest Colorado, Utah, Nevada, and ended up in Los Angeles. It was the longest, crookedest, roughest trade route in the old west. You'll be riding along the main leg up Salina Canyon and then along part of the Fish Lake Cut-off, where traders tried to shorten the route by cutting through the Fish Lake Basin. You'll need to trailer your machine just over 30 miles. You will ride some of the most scenic routes the Gooseberry system has to offer, including some challenging trails. A sack lunch will be provided by Quality Inn.

**NEW! Sulphurdale and Cove Fort Loop - Stage Ross's Pizza #2- Wednesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)**

This trailered ride begins at the Sulphurdale rock quarry and winds toward Gillies Hill, where riders enjoy an impressive overlook of the Beaver Valley. Continuing north, the route passes extinct volcanic features such as Cinder Crater and Red Knoll on the way to Cove Fort for lunch and a tour of the historic site. Afterward, the ride travels along the base of Little Shelly and Marbletop Mountains, visits the Sulphurdale geothermal areas, and follows Pine Creek Road through scenic mountain terrain before returning to the staging area. This trek blends great views with fascinating regional history, making it a favorite for riders of all interests.

**NEW! Summit of Salina Canyon - Stage at Top Stop #21 - Wednesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)**

From Richfield we'll trailer 50 miles to the Staging Area at the summit of Salina Canyon. Starting our ride up Clear Creek trail passing Kinney Meadows working our way east to a scenic view from top of Red Canyon Hole. We'll pass by Mt. Hilgard elevation head east to Sheep Valley then head south, making our way to Johnson Reservoir. Another great view while we have lunch. After lunch we'll head back to the Red Creek trail which will take us back to the staging area. Bring lunch and a camera.

**The Challenge, Sponsored by Big O Tires - Stage at City Park #10 - Tuesday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - ADVANCED)**

This ride is no simple stroll, it is THE Challenge. Trekking into Flat Canyon, Sidewinder, Rockwood, and Red View. We will be doing some trails, some roads, and some rock crawling as we wander the West Mountain. Your full attention is needed all the way, with very little of the route being on roads.

**Three Mountain Adventure - Stage at Ogden's #16 - Thursday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - ADVANCED)**

We start in Monroe. You'll have to trailer 10 miles to the unloading area. Then it is south and east over the top of the mountain. Riders are in for a treat – as they wind and traverse through three different mountain ranges including Monroe, Langdon and Forshea. The ride offers fantastic vistas to the east, south and west as well and some of the most beautiful fall leaves anywhere.

**Twelve Mile, Sponsored by Info West - Stage at U-Haul #19 - Tuesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 66" OR LESS - ADVANCED)**

The ride requires that you trailer your machine 30 miles north to Salina up East Willow Creek. During the ride we will head out to Mayfield, from there we will head up twelve mile canyon climbing from 5,538 elev to over 11,000 passing some mountain lakes and mountain streams. We will come across scenic mountain views. There are a few decent vantage points where we might see elk and deer. The ride will be at high elevation so bring extra warm clothes. There are a few challenging spots, nothing too crazy.

**Up, Over, Around and Down, Sponsored by Big O Tires - Stage at City Park #6 - Thursday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)**

We will ride on Monroe and Cove Mountains hitting lots of roads mixed with trails. We will visit Manning Meadow Reservoir, Koosharem Guard Station, Big Lake, Annabella Reservoir and as many trails as possible depending on weather and trail conditions. You will love the fall colors and wildlife. This ride will go at a good pace to get home at a decent time. Bring lunch and gas. This should be a fun ride!

**Upper Quitchupah, Sponsored by All Washed Up - Stage at Rocky Mtn Power #3 - Monday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - BEGINNER)**

Embark on an unforgettable journey by trailering approximately 37 miles to Acord Lake. This scenic ride offers breathtaking views of majestic ponderosa pines, vibrant aspen forests, and awe-inspiring overlooks that will leave you speechless. It's an adventure you absolutely do not want to miss. To make your experience even better, All Washed Up will provide a delicious lunch, and you'll receive tokens to wash your machine after the ride. So gear up and get ready for a memorable day in nature!

**Vanilla or Chocolate, Sponsored by Monroe Canyon's RV - Stage at U-Haul #18 - Monday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZED MACHINE - INTERMEDIATE)**

This is a great, "get to know the area" ride focusing on the north and central portions of Monroe Mountain. After leaving Monroe you will head up and over Cove Mountain past Big Lake, into the conifer and aspen forest zone. Then over towards Monroe Mountain while staying high in elevation. This ride offers beautiful views of Grass Valley early in the day and Sevier Valley during the afternoon. The best ice cream in the state will be available to purchase after the ride. You'll need a full tank of gas.

**Water Hollow - Stage at Ross's Pizza #1 - Friday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 50" OR LESS - ADVANCED)**

We make our way to the Gooseberry exit along Interstate 70. From there, we will take in the trails that make up the north side of the Gooseberry system. Spending most of the day on the Great Western Trail and a bit of the Old Spanish Trail. Bring along a lunch, camera, and a healthy appetite for riding.

**West Mountain Meander, Sponsored by Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) - Stage at Trailhead #5
- Monday & Thursday
(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - BEGINNER)**

This is a slow and easy ride up on the Pahvant Mountain range where participants will take their time to stop and smell the roses. It's a lazy day ride through the mountains to the west of Richfield. This ride will leave at 8:25 am from the staging area.

**Whispering Canyon, Sponsored by the Fremont Indian State Park - Stage at Home Depot #20 -
Friday
(TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZED MACHINE - BEGINNER)**

Come join us as we meander through Clear Creek Canyon. We will trailer to the Max Reid Trailhead across from the museum at Fremont Indian State Park. We will have a uniquely guided tour by park staff (behind the scenes tour of the park) where we will experience prehistoric and historic sites. We will see exclusive views of not often seen rock art from the seat of your machine. We will follow a route to exciting petroglyphs, pioneer history, geological formations, and many other interesting behind-the-scenes panels that most visitors don't see. Come and see these panels and hear these cultural stories. Pack your lunch and join us for a great ride.

**Willow Creek - Stage at Rocky Mtn Power #3 - Tuesday
(TRAILER NEEDED, 66" OR LESS - INTERMEDIATE)**

We will trailer to Gooseberry Trail Head up Salina Canyon and head to Anthony's Flat then circle Musina Peak. The elevation of Musina Peak is 10,984 which we view from several different locations along the way. We'll continue along Skyline Drive until we reach an overlook of White Mountain, where we'll stop for lunch. This truly is one of the most beautiful places in the entire valley. You'll be looking down on Skutumpah Reservoir. We'll circle back to the Skyline Drive and head back to the trucks. Make sure you have plenty of fuel.

**Winger's Roadhouse Hot Wings Special, Sponsored by Winger's - Stage at Fairgrounds #13 -
Monday & Wednesday**

(NO TRAILER NEEDED, OPEN TO ANY SIZE MACHINE - BEGINNER)

This one involves fun, great views of the valley with snacks provided by Winger's Roadhouse of Richfield, the ride sponsors. This is a slow paced, easy trek along the base of Monroe Mountain to a favorite overlook that the locals call Thompson Basin. Riders are rewarded with a breathtaking view of the entire Sevier Valley.
